

Jobs will alsoe be plentiful in the technical fields and in retail establishments, such as stores and restaurants. The expansion in theis fieds is due to several factors: an aging population, numerous technical breakthroughs, and or changing lifestyles. The highest-paying jobs will go to people with degrees in science, computrs, engineering, and health kare.


