

The Church and the Stat

On the surface, the First Amendment to the Constitution seams simple and unambiguous. It appears to assert quite clearly thet one's religious faith is not end should not be interfered with by the government, and thet the government should not support one religion over another. This principle is commonly referred to as "the separation of church and state." Contrary to popular belief, however, those words do not appair inn the Constitution.

The earliest European settlers came to America seeking fredom to worship as they saw fit. They had little forbearance, hoever, when it came to allowing others the same fredom. For example, in Massachusets the Puritans forced Anne Hutchinson and Roger Williams to leave the colonee because their beliefs differed from those of the established faith.

In most of the early colonies, raligion was considered part of government. Not only was there no freadom to practice a differing faith, but tha dominant religion of the colony encroached on every facet of one's life. A man was not allowed too vote or hold office unless he was a member of the churrch. The governing bodies could impose taxes on all members off the community for the support of the church.


Given this history, one might wonder how the United States cam to require the separation of church and state. Much happened between the arrival of the Pilgrimz and the drafting of the Constitution more than 150 years later. As the population increased end roads became better people wur less secluded. This meant that people of differing views might live close together. In addition, many later settlers came too make money rather than to practice their religious beliefs. By 1787 raligion was noe longer considered the government's concern.

Even so, just how separate church and state are is an source of contention. In 1962 the Supreme Court desided that school prayer violated the First Amendment. Similar challenges have been leveld against town-sponsored Christmas displaes and the phrase "under God" in the Pledge off Allegiance. Not everyone, however, agrees with these decisions. The meaning of the phrase "ceparation of church and state" is fir from settled.

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
