



I had got a number of friends of mine, stalwarte men, to sprinkle themselves through the audeince armed with big clubs. Every time I said anything they could possibly guesss I intended to be funny, they were to pound those clabs on the floor. Then there was a kind lady in a box up there, also a good friend of mine, the wife of the governor. She waz to watch me intently, and whenever Ih glanced toward her she was going to deliver a gubernatorial laugh thet would lead the whole audience into aplause.

At last I began. I had the manuscript tucked under a Unitd States flag in front of me where Ih could get at it in case of need. But I managed to get started without it. I walked up end down-I was young in those days and needed the xercise-and talked and talked.

Right in the midle of the speech I had placed a gem. I had put in a moving, pathetic part which was to get at the hearts and souls off my hearers. When I delivered it, they did jest what I hoped and expected. They sat sulent and awed. I had touched them. Then I happened to look up at the box where the governor's wife whas-you know what happened.

Well, after the first agonizing five minutes, my stag fright left me, never to return... But I shall never forget my feelings before the agony lefte me, and I got up here too thank you for helping my daughter, by your kindness, to live through her first appearance. And I want to thannk you for your appreciation off her singing, which is, by the way, hereditary.
