7. Of such excellence, grandeur, or beauty as to inspire great admiration or awe.
8. Extensive, treeless plains in South America, particularly in Argentina, known for their rich soil and grassy landscape.
9. A complicated irregular network of passages or paths, often used metaphorically to describe something complex and intricate.
10. A mixture or medley; a variety of different things.
11. A picture or pattern produced by arranging together small colored pieces of hard material, such as stone, tile, or glass; used metaphorically to describe a complex collection or mixture.
12. A tall, slender, pointed structure on top of a building, especially a church tower; used here to describe the peak-like shape of mountains.
13. The variety of plant and animal life in a particular habitat, a high level of which is usually considered to be important and desirable.
14. A very hard, granular, crystalline, igneous rock consisting mainly of quartz, mica, and feldspar; often mentioned in geology and natural landscapes.
